



**Antonio Sanchez**

Antonio Sanchez-Aguilar is an Associate Professor of Computer Science at Texas Christian University in Fort Worth, Texas. He is a founding member of LANIA (National Laboratory for Advanced Information Science) in Xalapa, Mexico. His current areas of research are the use of Java in teaching AI, Data Mining and Visualization, Collective Learning Systems and Image Recognition.

From 1979 to 2004 he was associated with Universidad de las Americas in Cholula Puebla, Mexico. He was professor at the Department of Computer Science and the Department Business Administration. From 1988 to 2001 he was Vice President for Academic Support at the same institution. His responsibilities included the general management of all computing, telephony, telecommunications, and networking services, as well as library, video, and radio operations, plus other areas of academic support. The Computing academic infrastructure project of the university received a Laurate Nomination from the Computerworld Honors Program in 2001. He has taught both at the bachelors and the masters level in the Department of Computer Science and the Department of Business Administration. During his academic tenure at Universidad de las Americas, Chairman of the CS Department, Dean of the School of Engineering, and Academic Vice President before taking the position of Vice President for Academic Support. He consistently maintained his involvement with teaching and research while holding his administrative positions. Previously, he served as project chief and consultant in ITSA in Mexico City.

Dr. Sanchez holds a Doctor of Science and a Masters Degree in Computer Science from The George Washington University in Washington DC, as well as a Bachelors Degree in Engineering from the Universidad Iberoamericana in Mexico City. He has more than 50 publications in the areas of Client/Server Administration, Artificial Intelligence, and Data Bases. He served as President of the Board of LANIA from 2002 to 2008. He served as President of the SMIA (Mexican Society of Artificial Intelligence) from 1991 to 1993 and of the SMCC (Mexican Society of Computer Sciences) from 2001 to 2003. He is honorary member of the Phi Beta Delta and Upsilon Pi Epsilon societies.
